Course Objectives: The goal of this course is for you to become comfortable listening to and speaking in simple and routine tasks.

Learning Outcomes: After you finish this course, you will be able to:

1. Predict what you will hear;
2. Listen for and name main ideas;
3. Connect information to personal experience;
4. Listen and talk about speaker's feelings and listen for changes in speaker's tone;
5. Express and give reasons for opinions;
6. Role-play brief conversations;
7. Make small talk;
8. Talk about skills;
9. Make and agree on suggestions, refuse suggestions;
10. Interview a classmate and share interview information;
11. Talk about information from charts and;
12. Describe pictures.

Program Length: ESL Level 2 is divided into 3 modules, and each module is 4 weeks in length. However, the length of your individual educational program depends on your commitment to the school.
